**How do the questions collect information on the agreed Standard Performance Measures (SPMs)?**

There are usually two questions for each SPM<sup>1</sup>. The first question gathers data on the numerator, and the second for the denominator. In total there are 20 questions for Development Partners (DPs) and 26 for IHP+ Governments. These main questions are supplemented by a limited number of additional questions (see: ‘Supplementary Questions’) to provide more contextual understanding and to provide explanations. Answers to these questions will be summarised and added as brief narrative to the Partner Scorecard.

**Where do the targets come from?**

Both, SPMs and their respective targets were agreed by the IHP+ Working Group on Mutual Accountability and ratified by the SURG in July 2010. These reflect the [Paris Indicator targets](#) as far as possible. We have included the targets in the survey tool so you can reflect on your progress in the “Answers and additional information” column.

## Why are some boxes grey?

## What should I put in the Baseline Data?

For those targets that are taken from the Paris Declaration, the baseline data should be from calendar year 2005<sup>3</sup>. Where the baseline year is fixed in this way, we have made it clear in the survey tool. For all other questions, baseline data should be taken from calendar year 2007 when IHP+ was initiated.
